

## Collage – Glass Coasters

### Materials

- [Perfect Paper Adhesive - Gloss](#)
- [Piñata Ink](#)
- [Duo Adhesive](#)
- [Texture Sponge](#)
- [Gildenglitz Gilding Leaf](#)
- [Foil-It Tape](#)
- [Boxwood Tool](#)
- Four-Inch Glass Squares
- Fine Sandpaper
- Pressed Flowers, gift wrap or decorative paper napkins

### Directions

1. Lightly sand the sides of the glass squares to remove sharp edges.
2. Choose napkins with floral design and cut out appropriate sections. Remove backing from cutouts, leaving just the top layer of the napkin cutout.
3. Apply napkin cutouts and/or dried flowers or fruits to the back of the top glass square with [Perfect Paper Adhesive - Gloss](#) and a paintbrush (figure A). Remember to remove the excess layers of napkin.
4. Cover the front side of the back glass square with [Duo Adhesive](#) and allow adhesive to become tacky.
5. Apply pieces of [Gildenglitz Gilding Leaf](#) to the tacky adhesive and burnish it with a [Texture Sponge](#). Don't cover the entire piece of glass; it won't matter that there is exposed adhesive.
6. Apply [Piñata Ink](#) to the tacky side of the glass square to fill in remainder of the uncovered surface (figure B).
7. Adhere the treated top piece of glass to the treated bottom piece using [Perfect Paper Adhesive - Gloss](#) (figure C).
8. Edge the stacked and glued glass "sandwich" with [Foil-It Tape](#) (figure D).
9. Use a [Boxwood Tool](#) to burnish tape to the glass (figure E).
